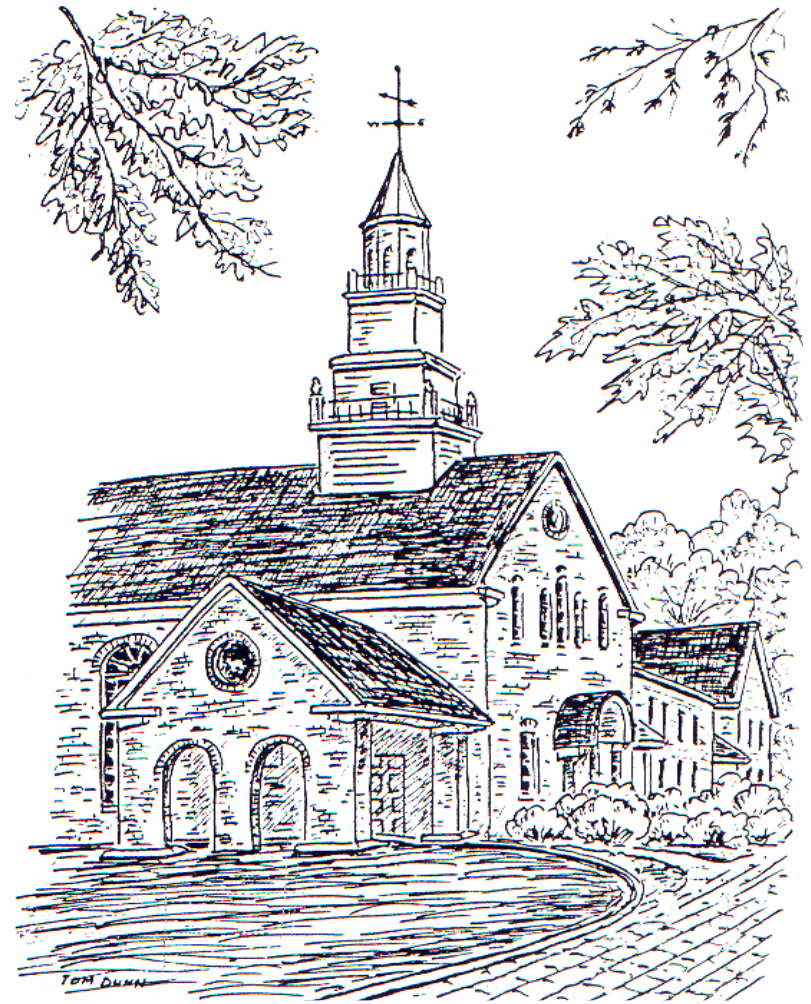
Our purpose is to make the Lord Jesus Christ a reality in the lives of people.
