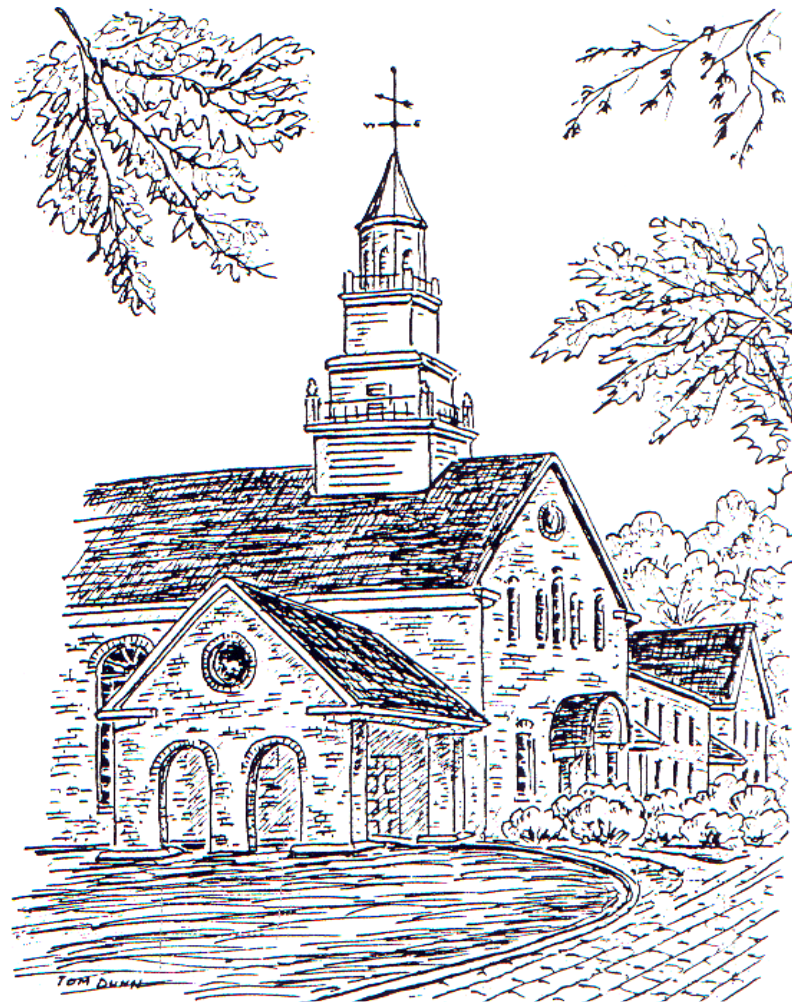

Liturgy for Advent Peace

The Lord is coming! We have been expecting Him! We have been waiting, and the time is drawing closer.

We rejoice at the good news of the Lord’s coming. We are ready for the celebration.
